Preface

by the President of EUROSAI

Dear ladies and gentlemen, Dear friends,

if you are reading this text now, I have already said goodbye to the presidency of the Supreme Audit Office in EUROSAI and handed over the imaginary ruling sceptre, in our case the crystal, to my Israeli colleagues. As with any presidency, I did not expect a trouble-free three years, however, the challenges we faced over the last three years were beyond my wildest dreams when I applied for the EUROSAI presidency.

The events of the past three years have been and continue to be the toughest test of European cohesion and the resilience not only of governments but also of supreme audit institutions. However, during the COVID-19 pandemic, EUROSAI clearly demonstrated its ability to respond agilely to new challenges, and adapt to new external circumstances. Similarly, EUROSAI demonstrated unwavering moral values during Russia's unprecedented aggression against Ukraine, and I am proud that together with my colleagues of the Governing Board we issued a statement on the situation in Ukraine and offered a helping hand to our colleagues from the Accounting Chamber of Ukraine.

Our XI EUROSAI Congress was the first one ever online and the Hamas aggression against Israel forced us to organise another online Congress again. But all these problems and the approach to their solution prove that EUROSAI is not ossified, that it can cope with unexpected challenges, and that cohesion is one of its strengths.

Supreme audit institution and EUROSAI have a lot to offer to the world. The results of our work are extremely valuable and I am therefore very pleased that EUROSAI was visible in the world under our presidency. However, we did not forget our auditors, for whom we have prepared a plethora of project groups, workshops, and initiatives.



EUROSAI is like a buffet, offering a wide range of choices from which everyone can choose what interests them most. And I believe that the Benchmarking Information Exchange Project (BIEP), which we set up for the purpose of professional knowledge and methodology be shared among auditors, will be instrumental in this strategy. It is not necessary to give all the details here. You can remind yourself of them by browsing through our publication. However, let me conclude with a simile. The presidency of EUROSAI felt akin to a roller coaster ride. One minute you are up, one minute you are down, and you don't know what is ahead. You sit in the first car and you grip the wheel. However, I was not alone. I knew that my fellow Governing Board members were in the cars behind me, advising me on where to slow down, where to speed up, and how to pick the sharp turn ahead. If it had not been for our combined efforts, our cart would probably have derailed. But as I said at the beginning, we don't get derailed, and we always reach our destination. I extend my heartfelt thanks to the Governing Board for their invaluable support and to every one of you for standing with

Vision of the Czech EUROSAI Presidency

The objective of EUROSAI Presidency of the Supreme Audit Office of the Czech Republic (NKÚ–Nejvyšší kontrolní úřad) was to offer EUROSAI members platforms to promote and further develop cooperation among SAIs and EUROSAI working groups and project groups.

As global events such as COVID-19 pandemic and war in Ukraine have shown, international cooperation has become even more important, particularly on issues related to pan-European topics, i.e. health care, environmental protection, transportation, digitalisation and the resilience of SAIs.







We were entrusted with hosting next EUROSAI Congress and presiding over EUROSAI for the next three years at the X EUROSAI Congress in Türkiye in 2017.

However, the emergence of COVID-19 pandemic forced us to postpone the takeover for a year.

after a year of intense planning, countless meetings, and endless cups of coffee, we were all set for the XI EUROSAI Congress. However, in response to the unprecedented challenges posed by the pandemic, we made the swift and strategic decision to transition the event to a virtual format.

...2021 STEPPING INTO A NEW CHAPTER

A key moment for NKÚ occurred when it took over the EUROSAI Presidency from the Turkish Court of Accounts in April 2021. On 7 April 2021, Miloslav Kala, the President of NKÚ, received the EUROSAI Presidential Crystal, a symbol of the Presidency, from the Ambassador of Türkiye to the Czech Republic, Egemen Bağış.

The aim of the Czech Presidency was to ensure smooth international cooperation for the next period 2021–2024. NKÚ took the helm not only to lead EUROSAI, but also to prioritise key focus areas such as

REFLECTING ON OUR MILESTONES IN 2021

Online XI EUROSAI CONGRESS

D-Day, 14 April 2021

As the pandemic made traditional face-to-face gatherings impossible, NKÚ came up with a new format and took a unique approach - hosting its XI Congress in a virtual format, a decision unprecedented in its long history.

Interpretation services were provided in all five official EUROSAI languages, enabling up to 250 people from 50 EUROSAI member SAIs and observers to participate. The Congress focused on administrative matters only.

In addition, the President of EUROSAI promised to host a post-Congress conference during which workshops and activities foreseen for the Congress could be organised.

We also welcomed the National Audit Office of Kosovo (KNAO) as a new member to EUROSAI in 2021.

What was discussed?

The Congress ended with meeting of the new Governing Board, where the President of the NKÚ set out the objectives of the Presidency.

During the discussion, the participants highlighted the crucial role of audits in preventing greenwashing. Participants shared complex case studies of climate change audits, demonstrating how audit analysis can help governments to optimise public spending in relation to climate change goals.

2022... SECOND YEAR OF THE PRESIDENCY



The year 2022 was marked by dramatic events in Ukraine. Russia militarily invaded Ukraine on Thursday, February 24. This act of aggression initiated a war that persists to the present.

On 3 March 2022, the President of NKÚ in his capacity as EUROSAI President, convened an extraordinary 56th online EUROSAI Governing Board meeting. During this meeting it was decided to discontinue cooperation with SAI Russia and SAI Belarus.

In response to the crisis, the Governing Board offered support to Ukrainian auditors and their families. Our training centre in Přestavlky hosted 56 refugees, including 37 adults and 19 children. As part of the Prague Post-Congress Get-Together, President of the Accounting Chamber of Ukraine visited Přestavlky in May 2022.





EUROSAI GOVERNING BOARD STATEMENT

on the situation in Ukraine

The EUROSAI Governing Board,

Bearing in mind the blatant violation of international law by the Russian Federation,

Condemning all acts of violence against the Ukraine population by Russian military troops,

Reaffirming the commitment of all EUROSAI members to cooperate in the spirit of mutual respect and friendship,

Finding it paramount to facilitate the protection of the rule of law in EUROSAI member countries,

Determining that the current Russian aggression towards Ukraine continues to constitute a threat to the EUROSAI values and principles,

Having considered the call of the Accounting Chamber of Ukraine for condemning the Russian aggression on Ukraine and stripping the Accounting Chamber of Russia of membership in INTOSAI, and

Wishing to denounce all acts of violence against innocent citizens and express our support to the Ukrainian people and the Ukrainian SAI,

Has approved the following EUROSAI Governing Board Statement:

- The EUROSAI Governing Board suspends all cooperation with the Accounts Chamber of the Russian Federation and the State Control Committee of the Republic of Belarus and any government institution of the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus – effective immediately.
- 2. The EUROSAI Governing Board calls upon EUROSAI members to refrain from any cooperation with the Accounts Chamber of the Russian Federation and the State Control Committee of the Republic of Belarus, any government institutions of the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus, and refrain from participation in the events organized by those within or outside the cooperation frameworks of EUROSAI and INTOSAI.
- 3. The EUROSAI Governing Board calls INTOSAI to consider the suspension of the holding of office of INTOSAI Presidency of the Accounts Chamber of the Russian Federation and calls the Austrian Court of Audit in its capacity of the INTOSAI General Secretariat for assuming the role and duties emerging from the INTOSAI Presidency until the INTOSAI Presidency has been handed over to Tribunal de Contas da União at the XXIV INCOSAI in Brasília.
- 4. The EUROSAI Governing Board pledges the Accounting Chamber of Ukraine maximum support and assistance in performing their duties and maintaining its independence.

2023... MOVING FORWARD WITH RESILIENCE AND INNOVATION

This year was marked by the Hamas attacks on Israel in October, which changed the original plans for a face-to-face handover of the EUROSAI Presidency to our Israeli colleagues. The event was scheduled to take place during the XII EUROSAI Congress in Jerusalem in May 2024.

The COVID-19 crisis, which affected countries around the world, caught many unprepared and required rapid action to protect the health and safety of citizens. This underlines the importance of flexibility and staying ahead of both predictable and unpredictable challenges, leading to our focus on a portfolio of emerging issues.

First EUROSAI symposium on Emerging Issues

30-31 January 2023, London

The symposium covered two key themes from the EUROSAI Emerging Issues portfolio- Auditing Resilience of Public Services and Audit in the Era of Digital Transformation.

The first meeting of the Governing Board this year took place at the very beginning of the summer.

58th GB meeting

14-15 June 2023, Vilnius

The agenda included the implementation and progress of the EUROSAI Strategic Plan 2017–2024, discussions on the possible eighth EUROSAI Governance Portfolio on inclusiveness, preparations for the XII EUROSAI Congress 2024 and EUROSAI financial issues, among others.



Joint Forum EUROSAI and ECIIA on public sector

6 October 2023, Brussels

The Forum was officially opened by the President of EUROSAI and it aimed at continuing and strengthening the cooperation between EUROSAI and ECIIA (European Confederation of Institutes of Internal Auditing). Topics discussed included the different approaches to cooperation between internal and external audit, the role of internal audit in providing assurance, cooperation mechanisms for capacity building, and different models and approaches for cooperation in the field of assurance.



Greening SAIs conference

26 September 2023, Prague

A total of 136 guests, including 11 top representatives from EUROSAI members, participated in a joint discussion on environmental auditing.

At the conference, President of EUROSAI launched a new tradition by introducing the NKÚ President's Award and honoured President of SAI Germany for his outstanding contribution to the promotion of external audit.

The aim of **Strategic Goal 1** was to promote audit-related cooperation, to support the development of innovative approaches and methods, and to facilitate the sharing of knowledge. SAI Lithuania (GB member) together with SAI Germany (a non-GB member) were the co-leaders of this SG.



The objective of **Strategic Goal 2** was to facilitate and support needs-driven institutional capacity development initiatives, for example, through self-assessments, peer reviews and other evaluations, to promote and facilitate the implementation of INTOSAI's Framework of Professional Pronouncements. SAI Poland (as GB member) and SAI Sweden (as non-GB member) were co-leaders of this SG.

Governance portfolios

The EUROSAI Secretariat held the Relations with INTOSAI and its Regional Organisations portfolio, with the aim of managing relations with INTOSAI and its bodies, representing EUROSAI in structures, forums, and events to which it was invited, and enhancing EUROSAI cooperation with other INTOSAI Regional Organisations.

EUROSAI projects under NKÚ Presidency

Relaunch of EUROSAI's Website

The objective of this PG is to develop the EUROSAI website according to the modern parameters of official websites of international organisations.

Traveling club of experts

The main idea of this PG is to promote informal professional cooperation among auditors on topics related to auditing and audit methodology that aren't covered by EUROSAI working groups, networks, project groups, or other activities, and to involve a larger number of SAIs in EUROSAI's activities- at the level of auditors.

Data development analysis (DEA)

This project group focused on DEA, a quantitative method widely used in performance auditing to measure the effectiveness of decision-making units. The aim of the project is to strengthen skills in the use of DEA, to share experience and practical knowledge, to promote mutual cooperation and also to focus on other benchmarking methods.

Audit English

The aim of this project group is to make a direct contribution to the harmonisation of English language terminology in the field of public audit.

Audit methodology seminar

The methodology seminar covers topics such as audit selection, audit execution, audit quality assurance and communication of audit results.

Innovations in EUROSAI

This project group focuses on innovative products and practices and their relevance to current INTOSAI/ EUROSAI events.

Benefits and Methodologies of Real Time Audit

The objective of this project group is to promote cooperation among SAIs in implementing and optimising real-time auditing, particularly in response to emergencies. It aims to share best practice and develop a common framework carrying out this type of audit.

Auditing in the new normal Connecting Technology to Audit Processes

The objective of this project group is to identify the current situation among SAIs in linking technology to audit processes, to share best practices, to identify the needs/gaps in this area and to prepare a roadmap for the post COVID-19 era.

Raising the Awareness of the SAIs on the Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) of the auditees and using the ERM approach in developing risk-based annual audit plans

The objective of this project group was to determine the level of awareness of SAIs on risk management of auditees and to lay the groundwork for the development of methodology for developing risk-based annual audit plans and assessing risk management of auditees through understanding of the risk management structure of auditees.

Collaboration UN Agencies SAIs' SDGrelated Audit Processes, Türkiye

The engagement with the UN in Türkiye was structured around a mutual exchange of expertise, experience, and knowledge, with a focus on the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the inclusion of an SDG perspective in all types of SAI work related to SDG preparation and implementation.

PG on Drafting the EUROSAI Strategic Plan (ESP) for 2024–2030

The objective of this Project Group was to draft a Strategic Plan for the new EUROSAI strategic Period 2024-2030.

PG on EUROSAI regulations

The objective of this project group is to ensure that EUROSAI has the rules to function properly in the challenging European and global context in which its members carry on their duties.

PG on Capacity building on non-SAI stakeholder engagement

The objective of this project group was to expand upon previous work in civil society engagement and develop information for EUROSAI SAIs and their auditors in applying relevant civil society engagement practices in the various stages of audit work.

PG on auditing the response on the COVID-19 pandemic (transformed to Resilience and Preparedness)

The objectives for this project group were to coordinate and enhance communication among EUROSAI members on COVID-19 related work, facilitate the exchange of audit approaches and outputs such as COVID-19 audit programs and lessons from reports, and outline content for future lessons learned reports, including common questions, audit frameworks, and key facts for SAIs to use both domestically and internationally.

PG on Preparing for Future Risks and Climate Crisis: Time for Audit to Take a Long-term View

The project group's objectives are to enhance methodologies for auditing future risks, such as the climate crisis, and for evaluating financial practices focused on climate objectives. It aims to facilitate the sharing of audit approaches and experiences related to these areas, offering a platform for comparing and collaborating on relevant audits.
